## Report on Analysis of Feedback on Curriculum collected from Students

Students' feedback on Curriculum is made with an aim to study the responses of students on various aspects of curriculum such as coverage of syllabus, interest created in the class room, clarity of expressions, depth of subject content, level of latest developments taught, various methods of teaching implemented, teaching models and teaching aids used, etc.

#### Methodology

The feedback from Students is obtained through Structured Questionnaire which included 11 questions on various dimensions.

A five point Likert scale has been used with weights assigned from 1 to 5 to different levels as follows:

- 1- Poor
- 2- Average
- 3- Good
- 4- Very Good
- 5- Excellent

The Range of each order or level is determined by the following formula:

(Highest point in Likert Scale- Lowest point in Likert Scale)/Number of Levels used

Therefore,

Range = (5-1)/5 = 4/5 = 0.8. Hence, the following range is set for the analysis.





The consolidated results of Students' Feedback on Curriculum for the academic year 2020-2021 are shown in table-1 and Graph-1. Results reveal that mean score lies in the range of 'Excellent' for the dimensions including efforts to cover 100% of syllabus, clarity of expressions while teaching the topic, level of latest developments in the subject taught, encouraging the questions on the topic(4.29) and use of teaching models and teaching aids(4.33). Due to COVID-19 and online mode of teaching, the rating of students on curriculum has slightly decreased especially towards dimensions like interest generated among the students, depth of subject content coverage, class room activities and study projects.









# Action Taken Report on Feedback

Based on the extensive feedback collected from the stakeholders, i.e., Students, Teachers, Employers and Alumni, the authorities have taken the action on key issues rose in the feedback. Accordingly, the action plan has been implemented through the support of management and teachers. Year wise summary report is presented below.

# 2020-2021

As per the analysis made on the Students' feed-back, many among the students of Mathematics and Physics have felt difficulty to cope up with the topics included in the courses of Mathematics-I and Physics-I as per the revised CBCS system 2019-20.

Accordingly, Heads of the Department concerned are requested to take measures to arrange extra classes specifying the time schedule in the Time-Table.

Further, the students have felt difficulty to cope up with Online mode of teaching. Some of the students have faced the problems of technical difficulty. Hence, the faculty are informed to send the soft copy of notes and material through Whatsapp Groups and E-mails so that the students can understand the concepts better.

Feedback of teachers revealed that, the teachers have faced technical difficulty with teaching online through Free networking apps such as Google Meet and Zoom. The college has initiated quick resolution through engaging with Microsoft Teams and also increased the network bandwidth to avoid technical glitches.

# 2019-2020

Analysing the teachers' feedback report, many among the faculty urged the authorities to depute the Staff to participate in Refresher Course of the Academic Staff College, Osmania University, Hyderabad. Accordingly, the management has taken initiatives for encouraging the faculty to participate in Short Term Courses and Workshops in leading institutions such as NIT, Warangal, ASCI Hyderabad and other reputed institutions. Further, the management advised the Faculty members to actively enroll themselves for the Online NPTEL and MOOCS courses.



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# 2018-2019

Feedback analysis report on students mainly shows that, the management students have felt that they require more interactive sessions with Industry people. As such, college has organized more industry interactive sessions with corporate delegates on every Weekend. Further, a request mail sent to the TASK CEO Sri.Srikanth Sinha to arrange the Placement & Career Guidance programmes at least twice in a year. Further, based on the request from the students, the HODs of concerned departments have increased more number of remedial classes to have better preparation for exams to the slow learners.

# 2017-2018

Feed back analysis of the Alumni suggest that students should be trained in the latest Software Technologies which includes SAP, TALLY, Data Analytics, Python, Internet of things etc. so that they can expect better placements in leading ITES companies.

Further, students' feedback highlighted the need for more number of ICT enabled classrooms. According, the management made arrangements and taken necessary measures to provide the required facilities for better classroom teaching and learning.

#### 2016-2017

Feedback of the Employers states that need for training of the students in improving their communication skills. Accordingly, the faculty of the Department of English were advised to arrange for the special classes by inviting the Professors/Senior and experienced faculty from the University/other colleges to deliver Guest lectures and offer suitable training to cater the needs of the students. Based on the expectations of the Students from various programs and recommendations made by the HODs, the Value Added Courses are introduced to provide better exposure to the advanced courses among the students.





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
